<u>Notice of Continuance of</u> <u>Public Hearing on</u> <u>Exception to Spacing Requirements</u>

This Public Hearing to consider an application for exception to minimum spacing requirements is a continuation of the hearing originally held on December 16, 2024, for that purpose, for which notice was mailed, posted, and published in accordance with applicable law, and for which a continuance was publicly announced at the meeting until the time, date, and place posted in this notice.

The Prairielands GCD Board of Directors will hold a hearing(s) on the below-listed application(s) for Operating Permits or Permit Amendments. Notice of the Hearing on Permit Applications and Permit Amendments was also posted separately in accordance with the District Rules, and Chapter 36, Texas Water Code, no later than 10 days prior to the date of this hearing. The Public Hearing on Operating Permits and Permit Amendments will begin at 9:00 a.m., or upon the adjournment of the Public Hearing on Exception to Spacing Requirements.

OP-24-079 not to exceed 5,000,000 gallons annually for 2024→2027; Public Water Supply (AK);
 - 2) Texas Water Utilities, LP (West Meadow Subdivision) (PWS #1260063), for a proposed Operating Permit (OP-24-080) for additional groundwater production only in the amount of 792,800 gallons producing from well (PGCD-000890; 32.53620604, 97.46654546) located within CCN #12983 in Johnson County. OP-24-080 not to exceed 792,800 gallons annually for 2024→2027; Public Water Supply (KB);
 - 3) <u>City of Grandview (PWS #1260004), for authorization through an Operating Permit (OP-24-081) to amend an existing well registration to substantially alter and increase the maximum design production capacity from 134 GPM to 155 GPM. The existing well (PGCD-000181; 32.26902807, -97.18157744) is located within CCN #13225 in Johnson County at 101 S. Louisiana Street, Grandview; Public Water Supply (AK); and</u>
 - 4) City of Rio Vista (PWS #1260022), for a proposed amendment to an Operating Permit (OP-24-076) for additional groundwater production in the amount of 2,342,725 gallons producing from wells (PGCD-000830; 32.23401700, -97.37432500), and (PGCD-000831; 32.23943900, -97.37802500) located within CCN #11574 in Johnson County. OP-24-076-A not to exceed 4,947,375 gallons annually for 2024→2027; Public Water Supply (AK)

Any subject discussed in executive session may be subject to action during an open hearing or meeting.

Persons may make comments for or against an application for any type of permit, permit amendment, replacement well, or exception request without the need to request a contested case hearing on the application. However, persons wanting to protest an application involving a permit or permit amendment by requesting a contested case hearing must do so in writing in accordance with District Rule 10.6 that is

either received by the District or submitted at the public hearing in person before the time that the Board takes final action on the application, as set forth more specifically in the District Rules.
